How to become a **FUNERAL DIRECTOR/ EMBALMER**

Board of Embalmers and Funeral Directors

- A licensed must be obtained from the board
- There are three types of licenses
 - Embalmer Only, Funeral Director Only, Dual Funeral Director and Embalmer
- All applicants must be 18 years old
- Applicant holds a bachelors degree from an accredited institution

Education

- Applicants for Funeral Director only can hold a bachelors degree or higher in any field of study
- ✓ Applicants for an Embalmers License or Dual License must hold a bachelors degree in Mortuary Science
- Institutions with mortuary science programs are University of Cincinnati, Wayne State University, Pittsburgh Institute of Mortuary Science, Mid-America College of Funeral Service
- Terra State offers an associate degree in pre mortuary science that transfers to University of Cincinnati for completion of a bachelors degree

Apprenticeships

- Applicants for Embalmer only and Dual Funeral Director and Embalmer License must complete a certified 12 month apprenticeship under the instruction of a master funeral director/embalmer.
- ✓ Applicants for Funeral Director only license must complete a certified 24 month apprenticeship
- Average beginning salary for an apprentice is \$15- \$20 per hour (under \$41,600)

Examinations

- Applicants for Embalmer license need to pass the National Board Science Exam and Ohio Laws and Rules Exam
- Applicants for Funeral Director license need to pass the Ohio Laws and Rules Exam and National Board Funeral Arts Exam

55 Beginning Your Career

- Obtaining your license can be a long process but the fruits of your labor will be rewarded by the opportunities you will have to serve families in their time of need
 - Newly licensed funeral director earns an average salary of \$20 per hour
 - Newly licensed funeral director and embalmer earns an average salary of \$20- \$25 per hour
